3 You Need Legal Guidance

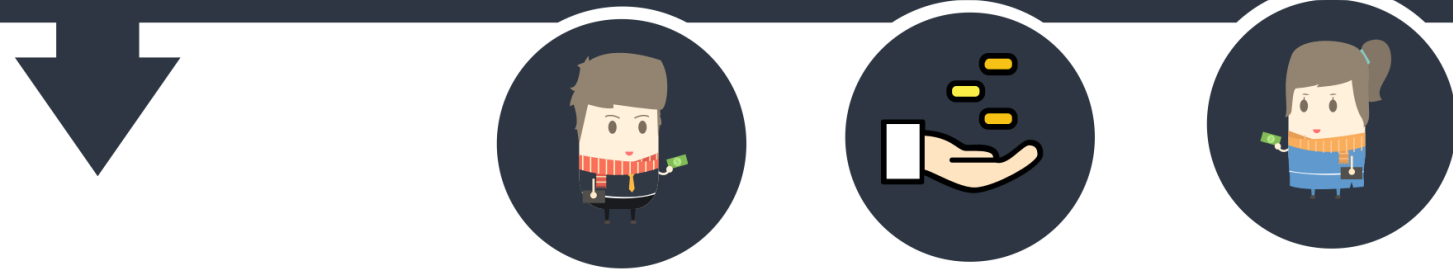


Tenant laws and regulations differ from place to place. You may not be able to follow up with all the legal procedures due to time constraints.
